Prince George's first Mother's Day is a picture of family bliss.

After champagne breakfast served up by her attentive husband, the Duchess of Cambridge welcomes the Queen, the Duchess of Cornwall and Carole Middleton to dote on the latest member of the Royal Family.

They sup champagne, nibble on canapes and take selfies on their mobiles in what appears to be a very middle-class gathering in the recently refurbished Apartment 1a at Kensington Palace.

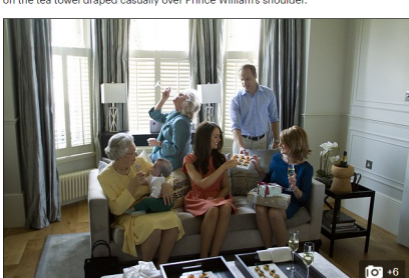

Or at least this is how photographer Alison Jackson imagines next Sunday's celebrations might look.

The artist is known for creating seemingly intimate images of the rich and famous using uncannily accurate lookalikes – and this is her latest project, commissioned by online store Notonthehighstreet.

Ten-month-old Prince George is depicted wearing a soft toy crown – possibly getting in some early practice for his regal life ahead – while the Queen's double drinks tea from a mug aptly bearing a crown and the slogan Mummy Rules, which is also seen on the tea towel draped casually over Prince William's shoulder.

A similar phrase is made into the Twitter hashtag #onerules and printed on to William's mobile phone cover, while other details include personalised cushions stating they are from the 'Cambridge residence'.

The items are in keeping with the playful tone of the photographs.

One shows Kate with rollers in her hair, entertaining her son as her husband naps on the sofa, an eye mask ensuring he get his beauty sleep; another shows Camilla eagerly draining her glass of champagne.

The future King and his young family have proved a popular subject for the photographer.

She has recently recreated the three of them enjoying a bubble bath together, as well as pictures of the new Royal parents getting to grips with changing nappies and breastfeeding.
