## Princess Charlotte first pictures show the Queen changing her nappy (but what's different?)

New photographs supposedly reveal the royal great granny isn't afraid to roll up her sleeves and get her hands dirty

New pictures reveal **Her Majesty's** touching first encounter with the **royal newborn**, in front of smiling parents **Prince William** and **Kate Middleton**.

The Queen, who is now a mum-of-four with eight grandchildren and four great grandchildren, is clearly now an expert when it comes to childcare.

First she was pictured testing the temperature of Charlotte's milk on the back of her hand, before giving her a quick feed and a clean-up.

Her Majesty, dressed in blue outfit with matching shoes, was later photographed cradling the princess while Prince William preps another bottle of milk.

In another picture, the Duchess of Cambridge, wearing a low cut red dress, feeds the now six-day-old Princess on the sofa.

Prince George on the other hand, is busy helping himself to a packet of Milky Buttons, while his great grandma, the Queen, checks the TV guide.

And the final photograph shows Prince William and Kate Middleton holding up their two children wearing adorable matching 'The Heir' and 'The Spare' baby grows.
